Skeptics: unconvinced, confused,

All the world's religions really are different. Different concepts of God, different values and moral codes, different paths to 'salvation.' To treat them all the same is profoundly dangerous. They can't all be 'true'!

Truth is not affected by sincerity or belief or desire. Just thinking something is true (or wanting it to be), doesn't make it true! Just because I believe Jesus rose from the dead, doesn't mean He really did... and just because someone DOESN'T believe in the resurrection, doesn't mean it didn't happen. Jesus tomb is either empty or holds His bones.

The claims of Jesus can be evaluated like any other objective truth claim. These historical truth claims are the foundation of all Christian beliefs, making it uniquely open to investigation of whether it's true or not!

✓	Truth: is not by sincerity, desire, or belief Just thinking something is true, doesn't make it true! Rejecting a fact doesn't cause it to disappear!
✓	There is an objective world. "Truth" must correspond to reality
✓	Many religious claims can be on objective truth Claims like "Jesus rose from the dead" must be true or not
Logic:	
✓	Relativism is self: Is the claim that 'all truth is relative,' absolutely true? If there is 1 absolute truth, why not 2?
✓	Relativism has confused opinions with: It's reasonable to have a positive or negative opinion of Jesus – but that doesn't change if He rose from the dead or not!
✓	Relativism is exceedingly: If no religion or moral system is 'wrong' or 'false' – then any evil can be allowed.
✓	Skepticism is just thoughtful : If it's impossible to know, then it's also impossible to judge!
